## Suspension of Face-to-Face Classes (Primary 2 & 4)

Today three P.2 students and five P.4 students were absent from school due to Upper Respiratory Tract Infection(URTI). We notified the Centre of Health Protection of the situation. The Centre requires us to <u>suspend face-to-face classes</u> (Primary 2 & 4) from Tuesday, 1st June, 2021 to Saturday, 5th June, 2021. (Other levels will continue to have face-to-face classes). The arrangements are as follows:

## 1. Class Suspension and Compulsory Testing

- The suspension of face-to-face classes will **start from Tuesday**, **1**<sup>st</sup> **June**, **2021 to Saturday**, **5**<sup>th</sup> **June**, **2021**. The classes will tentatively resume on Monday, **7**<sup>th</sup> June, 2021. The exact date will be based on the testing results. We will keep parents informed of the latest arrangements.
- ♦ According to the guidelines issued by the Centre, all P.2 and P.4 students, and teachers who teach these two levels are required to undergo **compulsory testing**.
- ♦ All P.2 and P.4 students are required to complete the compulsory testing <u>before Thursday</u>, 3<sup>rd</sup> <u>June</u>, 2021.
- Parents are required to make advance <u>booking by themselves</u> (for the compulsory testing). <a href="https://booking.communitytest.gov.hk">https://booking.communitytest.gov.hk</a>
- → Parents are required to bring their <u>identity documents and student ID cards or student</u> <u>handbooks</u>. Those who fail to prove their identities as our students will have to pay for the test.
- → Parents have to upload the testing result via MS Teams (chat room: class teacher) <u>before</u> <u>Saturday</u>, 5<sup>th</sup> <u>June</u>, 2021.
- ❖ Under the Prevention and Control of Disease (Compulsory Testing for Certain Persons) Regulation (Cap. 599J), the government can exercise the power and publish in the Gazette a compulsory testing notice. Any person who fails to comply with the testing notices commits an offence and may be fined a fixed penalty of \$5,000. The person would also be issued with a compulsory testing order requiring him or her to undergo testing within a specified time frame. Failure to comply with the order is an offence and the offender would be liable to a fine at level 4 (\$25,000) and imprisonment for six months.

## 2. Arrangements for P.2 and P.4 classes

- From <u>Tuesday</u>, 1<sup>st</sup> <u>June</u>, <u>2021</u> to <u>Friday</u>, 4<sup>th</sup> <u>June</u>, <u>2021</u>, P.2 and P.4 students will have <u>online</u> <u>lessons</u>. You may go to the school website (LTY Learn From Home) for the online lesson timetable. Cross-boundary students will have online lessons with their original classes.
- → From Tuesday, 1<sup>st</sup> June, 2021 to Thursday, 3<sup>rd</sup> June, 2021, cross-boundary students will have speaking examination and singing tests in the afternoon as scheduled. The online enrichment classes (for Primary 2 and 4) will be cancelled.

## 3. Arrangements for P.1, P.3, P.5 and P.6 classes

♦ P.1, P.3, P.5 and P.6 remain **unchanged** as **face-to face lessons** at school.

We will continue to stay in touch with the Centre. Parents will keep informed of the latest arrangements via e-School. Thank you.
